Summary of lecture

Entrepreneurship is often celebrated for its creativity and courage — less so for the struggles and the toll it can take on well-being of the people behind. As universities and ecosystems increasingly invest in entrepreneurship, we must also ask how to support the mental well-being of founders, the resilience of teams, and secure the long-term sustainability of entrepreneurial venturing.

In her inaugural lecture, Carina Lomberg will reflect on her journey of entrepreneurial education and research where she has pioneered the way to support entrepreneurial learning with a practice-oriented, interdisciplinary, and research-informed approach. She will also outline a future vision for entrepreneurship research and education that integrates mental health, inclusive learning technologies, and the dynamics of resilient teams with the goal to develop more robust entrepreneurs and ecosystems.

Carina Lomberg

Carina Lomberg is Professor for Psychology of Entrepreneurship at the Centre for Technology Entrepreneurship at DTU and Head of Study for the MSc in Technology Entrepreneurship. She is also a board member at Meta Learn, a Danish Mental Health Company, and at IST University of Applied Science.

Before joining DTU in 2015, she has been Assistant Professor for Entrepreneurship at the University of Bern (2011-2015), post-doctoral researcher at the chair for Entrepreneurship and Technology Commercialization at EPFL in Lausanne, Switzerland (2009-2011), and visiting scholar at the Australian Centre for Entrepreneurship at Queensland University for Technology (2013-2014).

Her research focusses on behavioural aspects of entrepreneurship including team dynamics, mental health and well-being, and entrepreneurial education. Her research has received several awards and acknowledgements and been published in leading academic journals such as Administrative Science Quarterly, Entrepreneurship Theory and Practice & Journal of Business Venturing. Carina has taught Entrepreneurship, Technology Commercialization, International Management and Research Methods for more than 15 years on all levels ranging from undergraduates to PhD and MBA.
